Chief Justice John Roberts Calls for Higher Judicial Pay

nited States Chief Justice John Roberts devoted his year-end report on the federal judiciary to a single topic—the need to increase pay for federal judges. He said that he focused on a single issue in an effort to get public attention on it.

Roberts noted that in 1969 a federal trial judge was paid \$40,000, more than a dean at a top law school (\$33,000) or a senior law-school professor (\$28,000).

Today, he said that federal judges make about *half* what those deans and professors are paid.

He argued that substantial salary increases are needed to keep a diverse pool of qualified applicants available for new vacancies and to keep current judges on the bench for the lifetime appointments that ensure judicial independence.
